Preparing

A Word ...

I invite you, therefore, in the name of the Church, to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word. BCP p265

These words, from the invitation read by the minister as part of the Ash Wednesday service really get at the heart of what Lent is about. Lent originated as a time for new Christians to focus their minds and spirits on their coming union with Christ in baptism. In those ancient days, most baptisms were of adults, not children, and represented a significant (and dangerous) choice. If we can imagine, as our forebearers did, baptism as a kind of death of the old self and the birth of a new self, then we can begin to see Lent as a period of grief



almost, of saying goodbye, and preparing ourselves for what awaits. The forty days of Lent comes from Jesus's time in the wilderness, where he said goodbye to his old self and determined to live into the purpose for which he was created, facing many temptations, and overcoming them in order to be able to share the good news that the kingdom of heaven has come near.

This experience was so meaningful to so many who undoubtedly felt so connected to Jesus through it, that they began setting aside time each year to renew that experience and reinvigorate their own faith. And the disciplines outlined, self-examination, repentance, self-denial, and immersion in God's Holy Word offer us the pathway to get in touch with God in deeper ways and to forge a stronger connection with Jesus in our own lives.

I pray that this is a meaningful season for you this year, and that together we might become an ever truer reflection of God's love that lights up the world.

Jon burned last year's palms to make ashes for Ash Wednesday and then distributed ashes to those present who could not make one of the Ash Wednesday services. It was a joyous and special night!



Food \$en\$e at St. Mark's is busier than ever

It seems lately that each month brings another record number of orders through the St. Mark's Food \$en\$e site. For instance, in 2023, January saw 64 orders while February had 66. In January 2024, there was a whopping 127 orders placed and last month 119 orders were taken. This meant a good deal of coordination of the volunteers led by Jim Miller to organize the delivery from unloading to pickup of the orders. Just to be clear, the unit orders feature 12 items from meat to produce but it does not come as a unit—volunteers have to sort and package each order along with the individual "specials" ordered. And keep track of whose order is whose. This group of hearty volunteers has developed quite the system which is amazing to watch. If you can, you should stop by sometime to check it out—and maybe pitch in. Volunteers are always welcome and needed now more than ever. It's worth mentioning, too, that each customer receives 2-3 free loaves of bread courtesy of a regular donation established by Gary and Chery Neddo.

This jump in orders is mainly contributed to the fact that in July of 2023, the Food Bank of CNY began offering the option to place orders online using a credit/debit card so customers weren't restricted to trying to get to a site to place an order in person. This was welcome news to so many Food \$en\$e customers, and there are many loyal ones
