Summer 2023 sees record Food \$en\$e numbers

While July saw a record 85 orders, the August Food \$en\$e delivery set another record for us...94 units. Fortunately, despite the appearance of chaos, we were able to unload, fill the 94 boxes (thanks, Shadybook Liquors), and get them to the families who had ordered. This was the first month of being able to order on-line using a credit card on the Food Bank of CNY's website (foodsense.foodbankcny.org) and it is becoming a popular option for folks as they do not need to come in to pay ahead.

We will continue have the customary in-person ordering for those who wish to use cash or an EBT card. We were again able to provide each individual with a bag of Pepperidge Farm bread. (Note: This is not a part of the Food Bank's Food \$en\$e program.)



We have also promoted Food \$en\$e at two school events – the Bellevue Elementary School Back to School Carnival on Saturday, August 26th, and one at Solvay High School, Thursday, August 31st.

The Vestry is also working in a continuous rhythm. We are honored to continue working to provide what we hope is the best for the parish.

Here are some notes from our August 21, 2023, meeting.

- Pat Dunn and Nancy Tucker are working to set up a committee for the annual internal audit, which is more extensive this year.
- ► Jim Miller provided many updates: he's visited Phil Buffham who continues to make slow progress, the street work needs to be completed before Allied Signs will place directional signs, online ordering of Food \$en\$e has increased the number of orders, and Barry Guinn and Jim have been battling ground bees on the property.
- Phyllis Honsinger reported that there were not enough Pride T-shirts sold to generate a profit. There are shirts available for purchase.
- The Craft Fair will be held Saturday, September 30. Crafters are still needed. Help will be needed Friday night to set up. We are also seeking donations for a bake sale and White Elephant Table. See Gail Manolescu.
- ► In September, we will return to presenting the elements. We will also be trying some chanting, starting with one of the Canticles.
- ► The St. Mark/St. Luke's picnic will be held on Sunday, August 27th. There will be one service at St Luke's at 10am.
- ► The third discernment meeting will be September 10th. During this session, different financial scenarios will be given to the groups. It is hoped that this will help the Vestry make decisions about the parish's future.
- ► Fr. Jon and Jackie Eberline have met with the Food Bank about the possibility of a partnership.
- Volunteers are still needed to help with the maintenance and cleaning of the parish. A sign -up sheet is available if you can help.
- A more defined evaluation process will be designed to assist with the future formulation of ministries.
- ► Kevin Ward continues to work on events for providing books to children either with a reading-to-dogs event or a book fair.
- ► A discussion was held regarding the collecting of funds for the Episcopal churches in Maui. The Episcopal Relief and Development will be used to extend our donations to Maui.
